#### **Independence Day Closing**

The State Library will be closed Monday, July 4, for the Fourth of July holiday. The library will resume normal business hours Tuesday, July 5.

#### **International Librarians Visit State Library**

The State Library hosted 21 librarians from China on June 24, as part of the 2016 Chinese Librarians Scholarly Exchange Program. The exchange program is a partnership between the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign and Chinese academic libraries. Participants in the exchange program visit libraries in the United States and learn about American culture. During the visit to Springfield, Taran Ley of the Reference staff explained the Little Free Library initiative; Karen Egan of the Library Development Group reviewed the state and federal library grant programs; and Sandra Fritz discussed the State Library's digital imaging programs including the Illinois Digital Archive and the Digital Public Library of America. Ms. Lanfang Yang of the Nanjing University of Aeronautics and Astronautics Library presented the State Library with a Chinese scroll that is on display in Rooms 403-404. The visit was coordinated by the Illinois Fire Service Institute at the University of Illinois.

#### **Project Outcome Celebrates One Year**

In just 12 months, [Project Outcome](#) has seen hundreds of public libraries of all sizes distribute and collect almost 15,000 patron responses to the Project Outcome surveys. The follow-up surveys will be available across six services areas and are designed to capture patron-reported behavior changes after a period of time has passed. Currently, 83 Illinois public libraries are participating in Project Outcome.

### **Illinois Department of Employment Service Update**

Libraries offer front-line resources and assistance to patrons who need to apply for unemployment insurance. Here is updated information and a marketing flier from the Illinois Department of Employment Security (IDES) that can be used to promote this service with library patrons.

Registration for work with the Illinois Employment Service is a general requirement for an individual to be eligible for Unemployment Insurance benefits. An individual who files a new Unemployment Insurance claim on or after July 17, 2016, and is subject to the registration requirement, must complete registration by logging on to [www.IllinoisJobLink.com](http://www.IllinoisJobLink.com). Benefits will not be paid until registration is complete. An individual's responses to questions on the application for Unemployment Insurance benefits will determine whether or not registration is required.

Registering for Employment Services will help connect Unemployment Insurance claimants with thousands of available jobs posted by employers ranging from entry level jobs to positions requiring an advanced degree. Registration also enables employers to find job seekers with skills that are in demand.

He was elected to the Illinois Appellate Court in 2014 and won the Edgar Allan Poe Award for his first novel, "Line of Vision" in 2002. Ellis has written 12 novels, four of which were co-written with author James Patterson. This week's Literacy Spotlight highlights **Literacy Volunteers of Illinois** in Chicago. A young man came to Literacy Volunteers of Illinois to improve his reading skills. The learner had been incarcerated most of his adult life and never attended school regularly. He realized that he needed help to turn his life around, and a tutoring program was the best way to improve his reading skills. The learner was very eager to be involved in the program and asked for an intensive tutoring schedule and extra homework. Within three months, his reading skills improved rapidly and he gained confidence and self esteem. With the help of a tutor, the learner was able to fill out job applications and the paper work involved with opening a bank account. The staff at Literacy Volunteers of Illinois helped the learner get his life back on track and will continue to help him improve his life.

## Illinois Digital Archives

On June 27, 1985, Route 66 was removed from the Federal Highway System. Started in 1926, Route 66 was important in migration patterns, supporting war efforts and enabling people to travel to California and to look for jobs during the Great Depression.
