You may send a representative to set up a table and collect resumes from individuals attending the fair. Please bring informational brochures about your repository and small descriptions of the projects available for the students. The internships may be either paid or unpaid. Internships may offer students the chance to gain necessary skills in archival science, records management, or preservation.

While it is not a requirement for participation, we ask that when selecting internship projects for the students, that you give preference to collections which document underrepresented groups, women's collections, photographic or sound archives, and local history.

All interns must be supervised by a professional archivist or librarian.
