Although personally unacquainted with you, I am desirous to now if there is any prospect for work on the Michigan Canal of which you are Chief Engineer, I have been in the way of Contracting and at present am engaged on Morris Canal and will finish my Contract by the 20 of August. and should be pleased to visit your part of the Country if there is any encouragement for a good contract, I can bring with me one Hundred men and more if wanted,

You will please give me the desired information what amount of contract and the going prices and specification if this should meet your approbation on the receipt of this and and You will oblige yours
