M. J. Hogan being duly sworn, says that he is managing owner of the aforesaid steam boat Nashotah and barges. That said boats are under the command of John Donovan. Carrying grain and other freight on Illinois and Michigan canal and Chicago river. That during two recent trips said boats were detained for the space of three days time. That I am informed and verily believe such detention was entirely without fault of the master and crew of said boats. But the said delay was caused wholly on account of lack of water in the said canal below the deep lock at Joliet, Ill. and also on the level known as the Summit level at or near Summit, Ill. Caused wholly by the acts of the Drainage trustees. That the acct. of damage stated above is just and true, and owing to me.
