

**DOCUMENT 13 – RESOLUTION CONCERNING A FLAG FOR THE CHICAGO  
INVINCIBLES**

**May 12, 1846**

**TRANSCRIPTION**

Whereas the Hon Augustus Garrett has raised a company of volunteers in this City, called the “Chicago Invincibles”, to be attached to the forces called into the field by the President, and has clothed the same at his own expense — and in view of his patriotic exertions in aiding in procuring clothing for other companies raised in this city — therefore be it

Resolved —

That the Common Council of the City of Chicago, present, through the Mayor, an appropriate flag to the Chicago Invincibles, and that a committee of three be appointed to procure the same.

That the Mayor and Clerk be authorized to draw an order upon the City Treasurer to defray the expense —
