

ILLINOIS CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION

Two Senators represent Illinois in the U.S. Senate and are elected to serve six-year terms. U.S. Senator Richard J. Durbin was elected to a third term in the November 2008 general election. Roland W. Burris was appointed on Dec. 30, 2008, to fill the remainder of Barack Obama's Senate term following his election as President. Despite initial controversy over the appointment, Burris was sworn in as the junior Senator from Illinois on Jan. 15, 2009.

Illinois is drawn into 19 congressional districts with one Representative elected from each to serve in the U.S. House of Representatives for two-year terms. The delegation currently includes 12 Democrats and seven Republicans.

Following his appointment as White House chief of staff by President Obama, Rahm Emanuel resigned his seat as Representative for the 5th Congressional District in January 2009. Cook County Commissioner Mike Quigley, who overcame a field of 11 other candidates in the Democratic primary, won the special election for the seat in April 2009.

For more than 20 years, the 14th Congressional District was represented by former Republican House Speaker Dennis Hastert. He resigned in the middle of his term in November 2007. In a stunning upset, political newcomer and physicist Bill Foster, a Democrat, won the special election for the seat in March 2008.

In the 11th Congressional District, former Illinois Senate Majority Leader Debbie Halvorson, a Democrat, won an open seat vacated by a Republican incumbent. U.S. Representative Jerry Weller, who had held the office since 1995, did not seek re-election.

The 18th Congressional District also became open with the retirement of U.S. Representative Ray LaHood (R), who had served since 1995. Former state Representative Aaron Schock (R) won the seat in November 2008, becoming the youngest member of the 111th Congress.

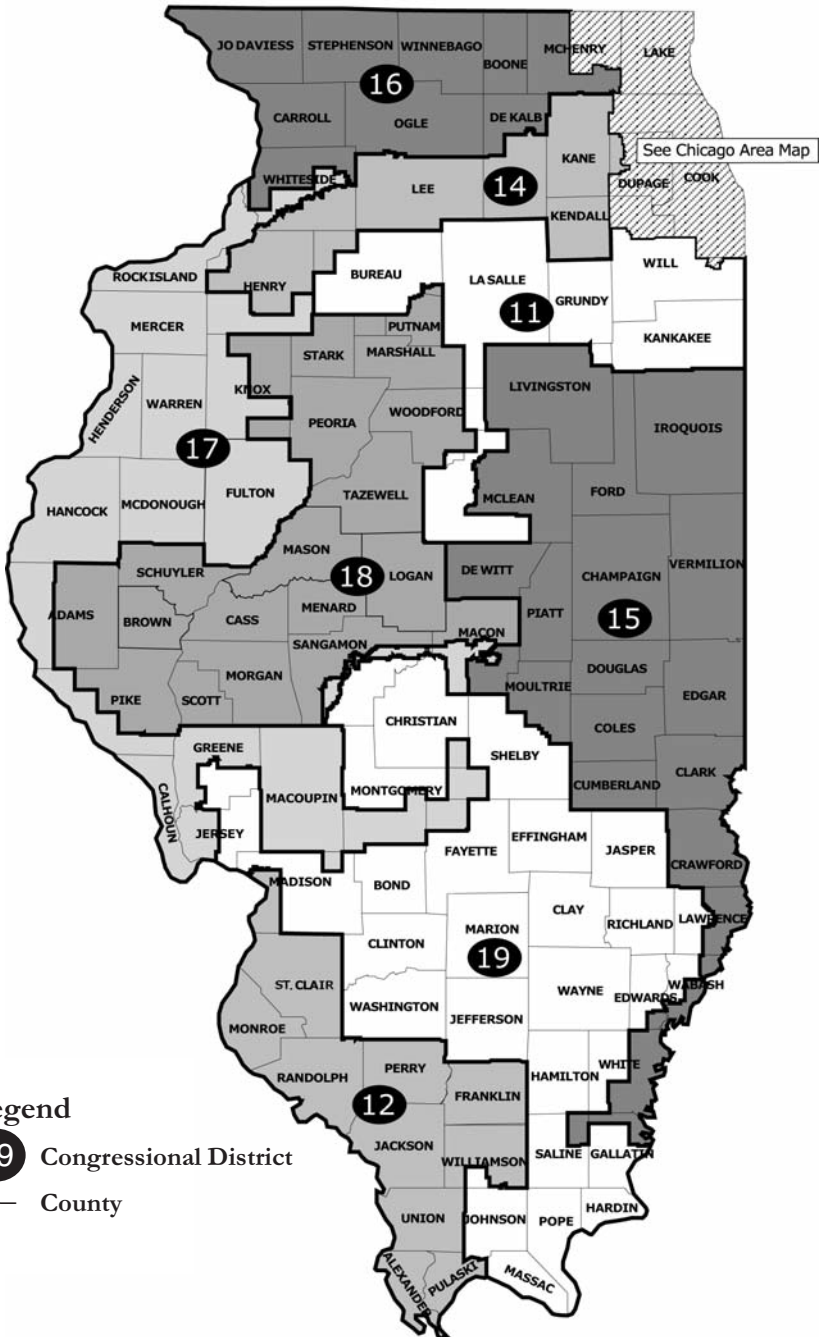

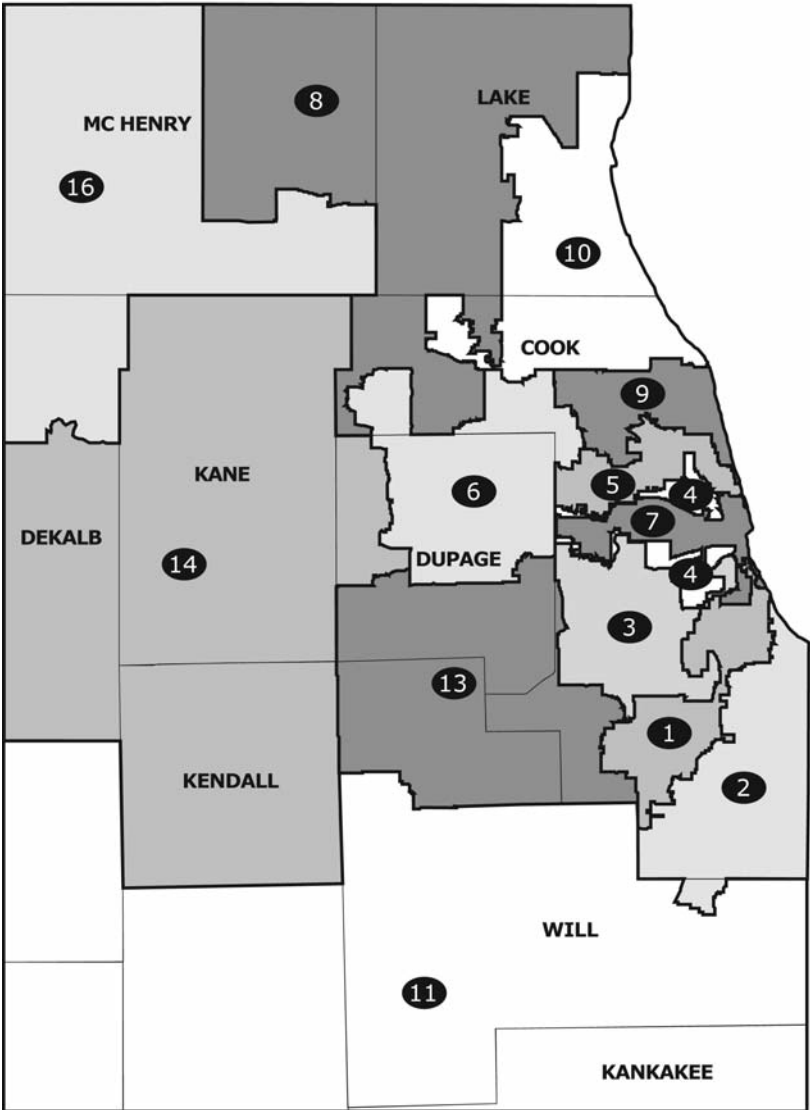
