

IDA: THE ILLINOIS DIGITAL ARCHIVES

The <u>Illinois Digital Archives</u> (www.idaillinois.org) was created in 2000 as a repository for the digital collections of the Illinois State Library as well as other libraries and cultural institutions in the state of Illinois.

There are nearly 200 collections in the <u>Illinois Digital Archives</u> which include:

- Photographs, slides, glass negatives
- Book Plates
- Oral histories
- Manuscripts and letters
- Illinois and federal government documents
- Postcards
- Posters
- Videos
- Newspapers
- Maps

The Archives also contain the following Illinois State Library collections:

- Illinois Veterans' History Project
- "Illinois Blue Books"
- Illinois State Highway Maps
- Railroad Maps of Illinois
- World War II posters (all have audio descriptions for the visually impaired)

Other noteworthy collections include:

- Over a dozen collections from the Curt Teich Postcard Archives, part of the <u>Lake County Discovery</u>
 <u>Museum</u>, recognized throughout the world as the largest public collection of postcards and related
 materials
- The rare book collection at the Lenhardt Library
- Unique, local history collections from the Chicago Botanic Garden, public libraries including Skokie, Quincy, Metamora, Mount Prospect, Galena and many more
